


IOM ALBANIA

STRENGTHENING ALBANIAN ANTI-TRAFFICKING CAPACITIES



The main objective of the project was to generate the necessary evidence to improve current legislation and programmes addressing the issue of Trafficking in Persons (TIP) in the Western Balkans (WB).

The project consisted in a needs-assessment of the current Counter Trafficking (CT) mechanisms in the region and evaluation of the current TIP situation in order to determine (I) which aspects of CT efforts throughout the region urgently need to be addressed and (2) possibilities for regional cooperation on CT issues.

The implementation of the project's activities led to the following outputs:

- A comprehensive final report analyzing existing CT mechanisms that each country already has in place and indicating needs and opportunities for regional collaboration to engage in CT activities (including an overview of recent changes in TIP trends in the region).
- A list of recommendations for policy makers to address the needs of, and gaps in, CT efforts identified by the research, as well as areas in which local and regional capacities may be developed to better engage in CT efforts.
- The presentation of a comprehensive final report and the list of recommendations to relevant stakeholders and policy makers at a regional validation workshop focused on stakeholders and policy makers' engagement and empowerment in further CT actions.
